1.0 RULES

- 1.1 These races will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations (YNZ Safety Regs) Part 2 Category 4 shall apply to keelers.
The YNZ Safety Regs Part 5 Category B shall apply to trailer yachts.
- 1.3 The RRS will be changed as follows:
- RRS Rule 29.2 is changed as per RYC General Sailing Instructions (GSI) 11.5.
 - RRS Rule 44.1 is changed as per GSI 13.2.
 - RRS Rule 51 is modified to allow boats with moveable/variable ballast systems and/or canting keels to compete.
 - RRS Rule 52 'Manual Power' shall not apply.
 - RRS Rule 60.1(a) is changed as per GSI 15.4
 - RRS Rule 62.1(a) is changed as per GSI 11.6.
- The changes appear in full in the GSI and may also change other racing rules.

2.0 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 These races are open to Keelers, Multihulls and Trailer yachts.
- 2.2 Eligible boats, including Richmond Sail-Pass holders, may enter the individual races by completing the online registration form on the website richmondyc.org.nz. Entries will be accepted until 60 minutes prior to the first start of each race day.
- 2.3 To be eligible to compete in these events each entrant shall be a financial member of a club recognised by YNZ.

3.0 FEES

- 4.3 Handicaps are assigned under the RYC Handicapping Policy as detailed in the GSI.
- 4.4 RYC reserves the right to assign boats to divisions deemed most appropriate; a boat's skipper will be notified if a reassignment is made.

5.0 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The current RYC GSI will apply for all races, available on the club website and in the club handbook .

6.0 VENUE

Races will be held on the Waitemata Harbour and Hauraki Gulf.

7.0 COURSES

The courses for the Singlehanded race are described in Appendix A: 2022-2023 RYC Harbour Courses ..

Kawau Night Race

From the start, Whangaparaoa Outermost Yellow Buoy (P), Motuketekete Island (P), Passage Reef (S), then to finish between a race committee boat (displaying an amber flashing light) and Momona Point.

Haystack Singlehanded Race

- 1 From the start, rounding Orapapa (Haystack) Island (S), Bean Rock Buoy (S), to finish.
- 2 From the start, rounding Orapapa (Haystack) Island (P), Bean Rock Buoy (S), to finish.

8.0 PRIZES

- 8.1 Prizes for the Singlehanded race will be awarded for each division as follows:
- Line
 - 1st Handicap
 - 2nd Handicap
 - 3rd Handicap
- 8.2 Line prizes must be collected at the prizegiving otherwise they will be forfeited.
- 8.3 Handicap prizes will be held at the Richmond Yacht Club office for 2 months and will be forfeited if not claimed within this timeframe. It is the skipper's responsibility to check the results and collect prizes.
- 8.4 Prizes will be awarded at Richmond Yacht Club after Races 1 & 3.
- 8.5 Trophies will be awarded at the RYC annual prizegiving.

9.0 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$5,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

10.0 ADDITIONAL SAFETY INFORMATION

Richmond Yacht Club requires that all skippers competing in the singlehanded races wear a life jacket and carry on their person a means to raise a rescue in the event that they fall overboard (e.g. waterproof VHF and/or a phone in a waterproof container).

11.0 DISCLAIMER

Competitors participate in the series entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the series.
